CONSIGNMENT TERMS & CONDITIONS

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Unless otherwise stated separately, online sales are conducted under the conditions below.

Best Wine Auctions Bvba, hereinafter referred to as "BWA", solely organises the online sale of wines and always acts exclusively as agent. BWA never acts as seller, buyer or owner in respect of any wines consigned for sale.

- 01 The principal (the seller) declares that the wines and goods consigned are the principal's property or, if not, that the principal has the owner's authorisation to sell the lot.
- 02 The principal (the seller) bears full responsibility for ownership, authenticity, the accuracy of the information, and the nature and condition of the wines consigned should any dispute arise after the sale. The principal undertakes to indemnify and hold BWA harmless against any possible legal proceedings.
- 03 The agent, referred to as BWA, accepts no responsibility whatsoever for the authenticity, labels, brands and vintages of the bottles. Full civil and criminal liability rests with the principal. The agent has the right at all times to apply any form of examination necessary to establish authenticity. This may include cutting the capsule in order to inspect the cork and all information visible on it.
- 04 When delivering a lot, the principal (the seller) may specify a reserve price. This is the minimum hammer price, including the seller's commission, at which a lot may be considered sold. The reserve price must be in line with the actual market price and consistent with the advice given by BWA.
- 05 Upon successful allocation (sale), the principal owes BWA a commission. This commission varies according to the quality and quantity of the wines consigned.
- 06 BWA determines the date it considers most suitable for offering the wines at auction. BWA undertakes to offer the consigned wines at auction within six months at the latest from the date on which the wines were accepted on consignment.
- 07 The principal will be paid, after deduction of any commission and costs, upon presentation of this document. No later than that date, the principal shall collect the retained wines. Consigned wines that were not allocated may be stored and collected at the principal's own risk and under the principal's full responsibility.
- 08 Where BWA collects wines from the principal's premises at the principal's request, the collection takes place under BWA's full responsibility. This responsibility begins once the goods have been loaded. All documents required for transport can be provided by BWA. From collection until payment for the wines, BWA will bear responsibility by taking out the necessary insurance against theft, damage, fire, accident and operating liability.
- 09 If the principal appoints another party to collect the wines, this falls outside BWA's responsibility. BWA assumes responsibility only upon receipt of the wines at BWA's warehouses and until payment, by taking out the necessary insurance against theft, damage, fire, accident and operating liability.
- 10 If the buyer at auction refuses, for any reason, to collect or pay for the wines purchased, or fails to comply with the buyer's terms and conditions, the auction house will pay the principal only after a possible later resale, known as a forced resale. The principal may also opt to apply clause 11.
- 11 Unsold lots may, if desired, be sold to Belgium Wine Watchers at a mutually agreed sale price.
- 12 BWA can never be held liable if, before, after or during the auction, bottles are found to be leaking or corks have shifted. This falls under the responsibility of the agent.
- 13 The principal must always state whether or not the principal is subject to VAT. All possible tax consequences are for the principal's account.
- 14 All verbal agreements not confirmed in writing by BWA do not exist.
- 15 All of the above agreements are valid and enter into force only after this consignment form has been signed by both parties.
- 16 In the event of a dispute, only the Courts of Antwerp shall have jurisdiction.
